2024 Seminar Highlights:

The Greater Loop: Alone on the Edge - Mark Ervin Fuhrmann

Canadian record-holder Mark Fuhrmann recently completed a solo kayaking mission for nearly 300 days last August to become the first person to kayak solo from Halifax, to the Mississippi, Gulf of Mexico, and back; at 65 years young. His 11,000 km, 268-day expedition through Canada and the US wilderness, brought unthinkable psychological, physical, and sometimes life-threatening challenges. Along the way, he raised more than \$100K for charities including Captains Without Borders, a non-profit charity that supports underprivileged women through maritime training for their officer's certificate. Mark makes his debut at the Toronto Boat Show on opening weekend only from January 19 – 21.
